Statement

We were devastated by the loss of our beautiful Jozef as a result of a tip-over of an IKEA Malm dresser. We miss him so much. He would be turning 5 years old this April. We never thought that a two-year old could cause a dresser just 30" high to topple over and suffocate him. It was only later that we learned that this dresser was unstable by design and did not meet safety standards, and that this had happened to other little boys.

We are telling our story because we do not want this to happen to another family. We hope that IKEA will do much more to make consumers aware that these dressers have been recalled and are unsafe for use in any home with small children. We urge anyone who still owns a recalled IKEA dresser to return it to IKEA for a full refund, and want everyone to know that no receipt is necessary. We would also ask that news outlets which run this story include a link to show photos of the MALM dressers, and the recall page which lists the recalled dressers.

We are proud to honor Jozef's memory by contributing \$1,000,000 of the settlement proceeds to three special organizations that are fighting to protect children from dangerous products – Kids in Danger, Consumer Reports and the Consumer Federation of America.
